



INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT LATIN AMERICA

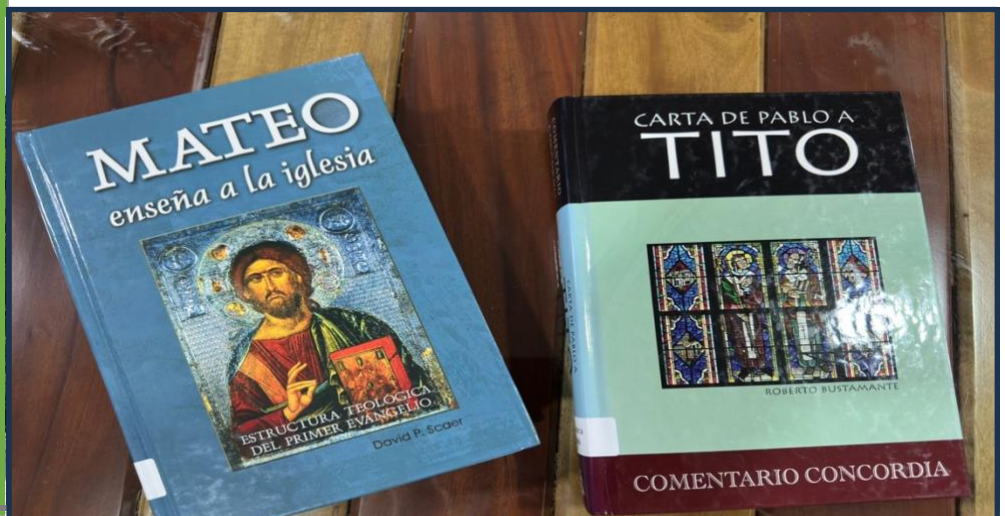
- + Colombia produces more than 90% of the world's emeralds.

One member of the Venezuelan Lutheran Church contacted Dan and informed him that she was helping to clear debris and helping to rescue survivors in the city of Caracas. We give thanks to God for her willingness to serve. Let us remember the people of Venezuela in your prayers.

Nonetheless he is teaching Biblical Hebrew to a future national pastor, Juan Morales, who is serving the Lord as a vicar at Iglesia Luterana San Pablo in Mexico City. 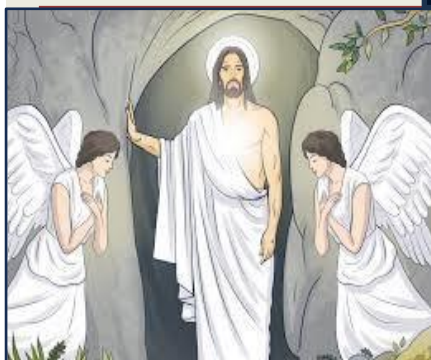
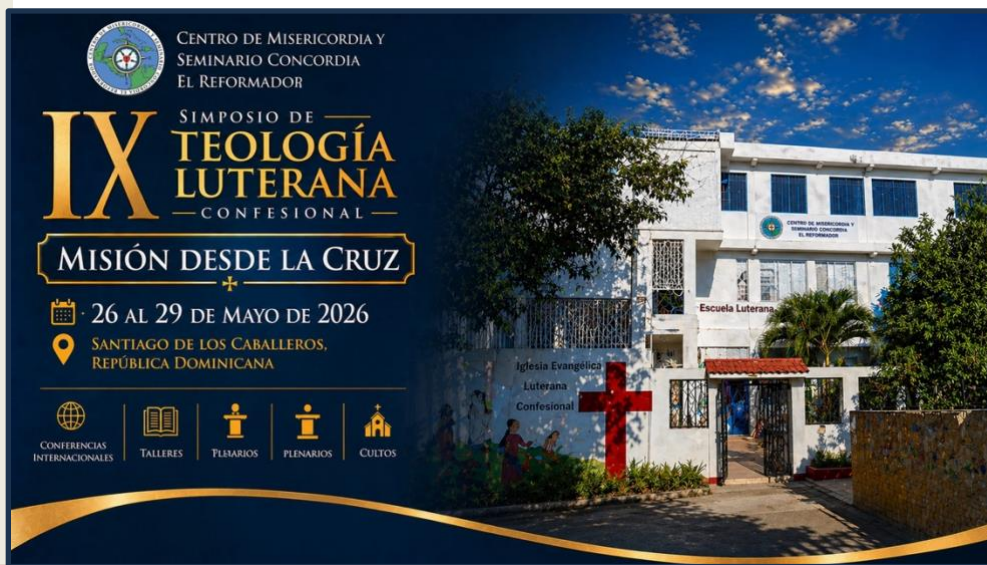
