He is Risen!

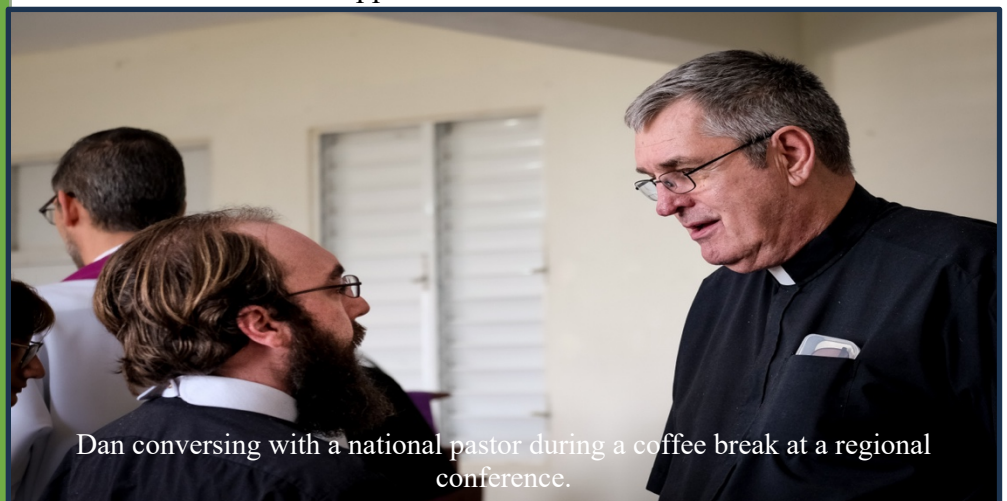

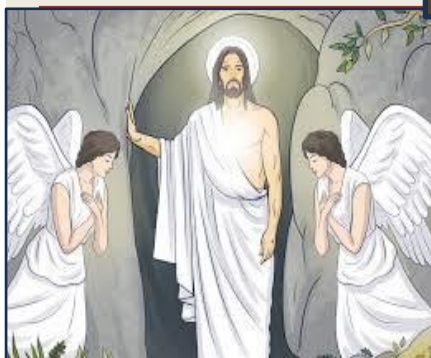


We Pray For
